LODGE 2073 DINNING ROOM DRESS CODE

Male Members, Visitors, and Guests are required to remove their hats upon entering the Dining Room. Shoes must be worn at all times by anyone in the Dining Room. After 7:00 PM the proper and acceptable dress for ladies and gentlemen inside the Dining Room is as follows: Ladies must wear slacks, pant suits, street dress, or gowns.
